## Highlights

- Utah's results on the math and science subtests for the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) were better than average, with rankings of 18<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> respectively.
- Many factors affect standardized test results. While low income students are most at risk for lower test scores, minority and Limited English Proficiency (LEP) students are affected as well. These factors can be exacerbated by test bias.
- Utah's statewide SAT 9 results have remained relatively static over the last five years. There were three notable changes from last year's scores, particularly in 11<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade social science scores, and 5<sup>th</sup> grade science scores—each of which declined significantly.
- This year's report includes charter and alternative school results. While these results should not be compared to the larger public school population, they are useful in monitoring the progress of these programs.

## Utah Statewide School Testing Results: 2001

Since 1990, Utah Foundation has offered an analysis of the results of Utah's Statewide Testing program. This program mandates that a uniform test, currently the 9<sup>th</sup> Edition of the Stanford Achievement Test (SAT 9), be administered to every 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grader in the state. This year, in addition to an analysis of the 2001 SAT 9 scores, this report will examine the 2000 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) scores in the areas of science and math. NAEP is a nationally administered program that tests a sample of students from forty states, including Utah, in order to provide data on national trends in education that are comparable across regions in the United States. Additionally, this report offers a look at two subsets of Utah's public education system: alternative schools and charter schools. Test results from these schools should only be compared to the greater public school population with caution because of their small populations and markedly different demographics. Their inclusion in this report provides the reader with a more accurate picture of the state of Utah's education system.

The public education system in Utah is continually evolving to meet changing demands. Perhaps the best evidence of this can be found in the passage of SB 28 by the 2001 General Session of the Utah Legislature. Most of its mandates went into effect on July 1, 2001. The bill amended the Utah Performance Assessments for Students (U-PASS) system by requiring that the State Board of Education, in collaboration with the forty school districts in the state, publicly report data relating to the public school system (this includes, but is not limited to, demographic data, test results, advanced placement and concurrent enrollment data, and staff qualifications) in a written format. Additionally, it augments the existing testing requirements by including a writing assessment of 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> graders, and starting in 2002, the completion of a basic skills test by 10<sup>th</sup> graders. The results of this latter test are recorded on a student's transcript.

The development of NAEP and U-PASS are indicative of the heightened emphasis on testing and comparing educational achievement both nationally and locally. While this knowledge is crucial for understanding ways to improve our public schools and ensuring quality in public education, there are many external factors that influence test scores. This report will look at three of these factors in relation to scores on the SAT 9 in detail: the number of students involved with the Limited English Proficiency program, the number of minority students, and the number of low-income students (those who receive a free or reduced price school lunch). These three factors were chosen for two reasons: first, because they are commonly held to be the most influential in determining success on norm-referenced standard achievement tests and second, because the bias in testing resulting from these factors has proven the most difficult to eliminate.

## **NAEP**

Utah has historically scored at or near the national average on the NAEP administered tests in all areas except science, where Utah has scored better than the national average. The results of the science and math tests for 2000 were no exception (see Figure 1). Of the 40 states administering the NAEP mathematics test, Utah ranks 18<sup>th</sup> with a raw score one point higher than the national average. In science, Utah ranks 12<sup>th</sup> nationally, with a score that is eight points higher than the national average. This indicates that Utah's students are better educated in science than the nation as a whole.

Figure 1 lists a sample of 17 states, including Utah, showing their performance on the science and math sections of the NAEP examinations. These states were picked for analysis because they represent the eight states immediately preceding and following Utah in raw numbers of students educated who also participate in the NAEP program.<sup>1</sup> When these states are viewed relative to each other, a slight correlation between the percentage of students in the private education system and performance on standardized tests emerges. It has been hypothesized that public school systems with high numbers of students in the private school system may score lower on standardized tests because they are losing talented students to large private school systems. This is not strongly demonstrated in our sample. There does seem to be a slight correlation between the two, particularly at the higher and lower ends of the scoring spectrum; however, while this seems to suggest Utah's scores should be significantly higher than average, because it educates a significantly higher number of students in the public education system, there is no strong evidence to support that this factor in isolation is causal. Factors that vary significantly between regions can also greatly impact a state's comparative performance on a nationally administered test. In Connecticut, for example, both the private school population and test scores were high—however other qualities of education indicators (such as per pupil expenditure) are also high.<sup>2</sup> Results can be significantly skewed from state to state based on differences in demographics.

## **Percentile Ranks as Scores**

Differences between districts within the state of Utah based on their performance on this year's SAT 9 provide a much more insightful look at factors which influence district performance. The scores in

most of these tables are school and district percentile ranks, which are determined by comparing a school or district's performance to the score achieved by the median student nationwide. Since the SAT 9 is a norm-referenced achievement test, a median score is derived; this is the score calculated in which half of the students score above that score, and half score below it. This median is then used as a point of comparison for a percentile rank—for example, if a school or district had a median percentile rank of 62 that would indicate that the median student for that particular school or district scored better than 62% of those students tested nationally. Percentile scores are therefore used to compare schools' performance against each other and against a national performance average.

## Demographic Factors Influencing Test Scores

Demographic factors can significantly influence a school's performance on a standard test. Figure 2 shows a list of all districts in the state of Utah. Using raw score data, a district median score was obtained. This was then compared to the presence of three factors: LEP enrollment, the percentage of minority students and the percentage of low-income students in a given district. The strongest correlation between demographic factors and test scores was found in the percentage of low-income students in a given district. However, a secondary correlation that is just as intriguing is the higher presence of minority and LEP students within districts with a large number of low-income students. This suggests that many students within these districts could face a multiplicity of factors that are correlated to lower performance on standardized tests. In this sample, the number of LEP students had the weakest correlation with test scores.

This is not surprising, since the scores of LEP students are not included within the median scores until the student has received two or more years of English language instruction. Even with this allowance, a large LEP student population generally indicates lower test performance. While the exclusion of LEP students from the testing pool is necessary in order to ensure that test results accurately



**Figure 3****Test Scores and Demographic Factors**



measure scholastic performance, it must be done consistently and can have a dramatic effect on test scores. This year's data allowed for a unique comparison of that effect. In 2000, the Salt Lake City School District used standards to exempt LEP students from testing that were not in line with Utah's statewide standards.<sup>3</sup> This resulted in the exclusion of 33% of 3<sup>rd</sup> graders from testing. Grades 5, 8, and 11 saw the exemption of 28%, 28%, and 22%, respectively, compared with 12%, 11% and 15% the year before.<sup>4</sup> Figures 4 shows the significant differences that resulted from that decision. With the exception of the 11<sup>th</sup> grade, which showed slight declines, the performance in all of these grade levels was significantly lower in 1999 and 2001 than in 2000. Additionally, the scores from 1999 and 2001 are quite similar, suggesting that the changes in 2000 were a result of the decision to exempt more LEP students.

Lower scores are not necessarily indicative of less ability, but could indicate the presence of any of a number or combination of the following: lack of resources within less wealthy school districts, larger class sizes, and/or weak LEP instruction, or test questions that are socio-economically or culturally biased.<sup>5</sup> These factors can affect test scores in a number of ways. LEP students, for example are often concentrated in districts that are already stretching their budgets among many students and special programs. This could exacerbate problems related to LEP instruction, and affect test scores. Additionally, some of the difference can be accounted for in biases of the test itself.

**Test Bias**

Figure 5 shows the performance of 4th grade students on the science NAEP sub-tests based on their racial and ethnic background.<sup>6</sup> With the exception of Asian

and Pacific Islanders the scores for this sub-test are markedly lower for minority students. Among the many factors that can influence test scores, one cause may be test bias. Bias is defined as “a systematic effect on performance rating that is based on factors not related to the performance itself.”<sup>7</sup> Bias can occur on many levels. Whether a student lives in a rural or urban area, economic status, race, English proficiency, and gender, can all influence a student’s performance on an exam.


Test bias is an issue that has been addressed by many educators and producers of standardized tests, particularly over the last twenty years. As tests have become more balanced, differences in scores have lessened. However, advocates for reform believe there is room for improvement. Regardless of cautions against placing stock in standardized tests as measures of intelligence and ability, test scores are often seen to be objective proof of capabilities, resources, and potential.

Reforms to remove bias can generally be divided along two lines. First, some have called for the replacement of standardized, norm-referenced tests, like the SAT 9, with performance assessments<sup>8</sup> that allow for open-ended questions as well as multiple-choice questions.<sup>9</sup> It is argued that these tests provide a more accurate portrayal of a student’s reasoning and capability. Opponents of radically altering the testing process argue that when a new system is introduced, new biases are introduced with it. This could result in a more biased system than we currently have. They contend, for example, that the adoption of performance assessments could lead to less objective tests because many of these assessments would be scored by individuals who could perceive the same answer differently. A second means of reducing test bias is similar to the status quo. Proponents of this view hold that we should continue to correct any biases found in standardized testing to the best of our ability. For example, some educators have pre-tested questions on different subsets of the population, and asked the children for their reasons for answering the questions the way they did. They then search for trends in logic among the population that could indicate a question is biased towards a certain group. Additionally, questions are carefully selected and put through rigorous tests before appearing on the SAT 9 or NAEP. Both pre-testing and careful selection of test questions have continued to reduce bias in testing.

Even with reductions in test bias, other factors continue to influence test scores. Many of these factors are outside the control of the public school system or the test producers. Variables that may indicate a test score should be low or high may be neutralized by different circumstances. For example, a student may be simultaneously a minority, LEP, and part of a lower-income bracket, but have an

### NAEP 4th Grade Science Scores by Race/Ethnicity



incredibly strong family support network and/or be naturally gifted. This could result in a higher than average score, regardless of the presence of factors that would predict otherwise. Another concern in comparing schools is that some very small schools or districts do not have enough students to make valid comparisons. In small testing populations the results of one gifted or struggling student significantly affects the median percentile rank of the entire school. Because of this, the Utah State Office of Education cautions that all school or district averages that have been derived from a population of less than 15 students should be viewed cautiously.

## Statewide Test Results: Public, Charter and Alternative Schools

Figure 6 shows Utah's statewide results on the SAT 9 in each area, including complete battery since 1997, the introductory year of the SAT 9. Scores for 3<sup>rd</sup> graders continue to lag behind the national average in language, however these scores approach the national median score in the 5<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade results. As was indicated by the NAEP science results, Utah's school children scored remarkably well in science in all grade levels. The only notable decline in scores from last year in science was seen at the 5<sup>th</sup> grade level, which dropped to the 60<sup>th</sup> percentile from 65<sup>th</sup> percentile. However, scores at the 60<sup>th</sup> percentile level were observed in 1997-1999, and the 2000 score of 65<sup>th</sup> percentile was uniquely high. Social science results for 8<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> graders continued to fluctuate greatly, with each grade seeing a significant decline in their scores from last year (6 and 10 percentile points, respectively). A similar score was observed in 1999 in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and in 1998 and 1999 in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade.

There are currently eight charter schools in Utah, seven of which test their students with the SAT 9.<sup>10</sup> It is important to remember when looking at charter schools in Utah that their results are not necessarily comparable to each other or the public school system. This is due to the nature of a charter school, which is to "encourage innovative teaching practices, empower teachers to actively design and implement learning opportunities, find new ways to measure learning outcomes and other forms of accountability, enhance the role of parents in making decisions at the school level, and foster school choice for parents and students."<sup>11</sup> This results in schools with widely varying missions, yet still characterized as a charter school. In Utah's small sample of charter schools alone, there are schools aimed at helping students at risk, students gifted in the performing arts, students with sensory disabilities, and students who are typical of the larger public school population. The specialized nature

of these missions can be seen in the results of the SAT 9. For example, Pinnacle Canyon focuses on developing critical thinking skills in core subjects, promotion of environmental awareness, and emphasizes the use of technology. This year's 5<sup>th</sup> grade science score of 82<sup>nd</sup> percentile is evidence of its focus on the environment and technology. The 3<sup>rd</sup> grade environment score of 62<sup>nd</sup> percentile (which includes social science and science testing) was also significantly better than the national median score. Tuacahn High School for the Performing Arts is a college preparatory school that places an emphasis on education in the arts. The motivation of its student population is evident in its test scores, which over the last two years have been consistently higher than the median score. In 2001, the basic battery score for Tuacahn was in the 61<sup>st</sup> percentile.

Charter schools are part of the public system; however, when calculations of district average percentiles are made, they are not included in those districts, precisely because of their various missions. These differences in both demographic population and teaching method or emphasis can result in wide variances in scores that are not necessarily indicative of the ability of the students or the overall success of the program. Finally, many charter school student populations are relatively small, which could result in wide fluctuations in median score from year to year.

Similar concerns about demographic population and class size plague a conclusive analysis of the scores for alternative schools; however, given recent initiatives at the state level aimed at providing for the expansion of the alternative school program from high schools

to middle schools, it is timely to take a closer look at this subset of Utah's public school system. In 1999, the Utah State Legislature passed the Alternative Middle Schools Act (HB 329). This law allocated \$2 million to establish an alternative middle schools program through the Families, Agencies, and Communities Together (FACT) Council.<sup>12</sup> It is not currently effective to broadly analyze the alternative school program for three reasons. First, class sizes are relatively small (some only consist of two or three students) and therefore, any computations made with those median scores would be statistically insignificant. Second, there are still many smaller communities in Utah that do not have separate alternative programs, particularly at the 8<sup>th</sup> grade level. This means that the scores for students participating in the alternative schools programs are included in the larger school population for some schools, and excluded for other schools. Third, it is readily apparent that the information for many of these schools is incomplete. Populations of students tested, low-income percentages, and in many cases subject/year scores, are missing. This not only hinders the analysis of alternative school data, but also has a slight impact on overall district averages, depending on the size of the alternative school in relation to the district, because district averages include alternative school data. Furthermore, the removal of students at risk (SARs) from the general school population can have an impact on the median scores of the school they attended previously, particularly if that school has 1) a large population of SARs, or 2) a small overall population that would be notably effected by the presence of what appears to be a small amount of students.

Alternative school data is included in the appendix tables for reference purposes, but should not be seen as proof of the failure or success of these schools. A comparison of alternative high schools shows large differences in scores that are not necessarily indicative of performance. For example, a comparison of Central High (Granite District) with Alpine Life and Learning (Alpine District)<sup>13</sup> shows that Alpine Life and Learning's basic battery score of 41<sup>st</sup> percentile, while significantly lower than the district average, is approaching the median score. Central's basic battery score of 30<sup>th</sup> percentile is significantly lower than Alpine Life and Learning, but still within its expected range of 28-49, indicating that it is performing adequately given its population.<sup>14</sup> This highlights the different factors influencing test scores and achievement. Data for all alternative schools is included in the appendix tables within each respective district for the first time this year.

## Conclusion

This report has attempted to offer two analyses: an overview of statewide performance in this year's SAT 9 and 2000's NAEP results and a brief explanation of *some* of the demographic variables that can effect those results. It is impossible in such a short space to include all variables that could hinder or augment student performance on examinations; however, a better understanding that these variables exist and can drastically affect test scores, allows for a more accurate interpretation of the data provided. Comparisons of districts and

schools based solely on test results are not necessarily valid because they ignore the socio-economic factors that affect those results, making these comparisons useful only when they are made within proper context.
